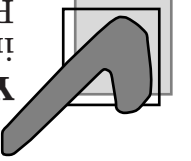

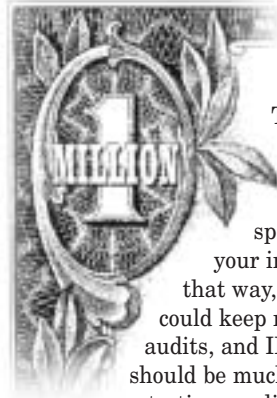

The U.S. Government Spends \$1,000,000 Every Four Seconds!

The numbers are almost too big to believe. Every four seconds that the Federal bureaucracy is open; the government spends \$1 million. That's \$15 million every minute. That's \$2.3 trillion every year (that's \$2,300,000,000,000). And who pays for this spending spree? You do – every penny of it, whether directly through your income tax or indirectly through business taxes. It doesn't have to be that way, though. With less government and dramatically lower taxes, you could keep more of what you earn – and not have to worry about red tape, audits, and IRS harassment. The Libertarian Party believes that your taxes should be much lower. Libertarians believe that if government were limited to protecting our lives, our Constitutional rights, and our property, then it could do those things better and at a small fraction of the cost. Why the Income Tax is Bad for America

- The average American works 171 days, from January 1 until June 20, just to pay his taxes.
- Government at all levels takes 47% of your income. How free are you when government takes 47% of the fruits of your labor? (In 1916, this was just 7%.)

- Set aside Federal Reserve dollar debasement (they steal even more by printing more money) and total government spending has doubled every ten years since 1953.
- The per person tax expense is over \$10,300 (\$7,100 federal and \$3,200 local). Compare this with the per person expense for: shelter \$5,800; health care \$3,800; food \$2,700; transportation \$2,500; recreation \$1,900; and clothing \$1,400.
- The income and social security taxes discourage work, saving, and investment, and act as a drag on economic growth.
- If we abolished the income tax this year, an additional \$900 billion would be available for productive private investment. The standard of living would zoom. Savings would increase and interest rates would fall. The phony system of “withholding” would be abolished. The increase in overall prosperity would be astounding.
- America had NO income tax for 134 years (1776-1861 & 1864-1913). America has had an income tax for 91+ years (1861-1864 & 1913-present).
- With the income tax has come involvement in two World Wars, the Civil War, Vietnam, the Great Depression, the high crime of alcohol & drug prohibition, the cold war, record inflation, a huge central government, the warfare/welfare state, poor government education, overseas resentment of America, family stress, and latchkey children.
- Times with no income tax reflect record economic growth, the great invention age, the industrial revolution, little or no inflation, decreasing poverty, low crime, adulation for America as the land of the free, and peace.
